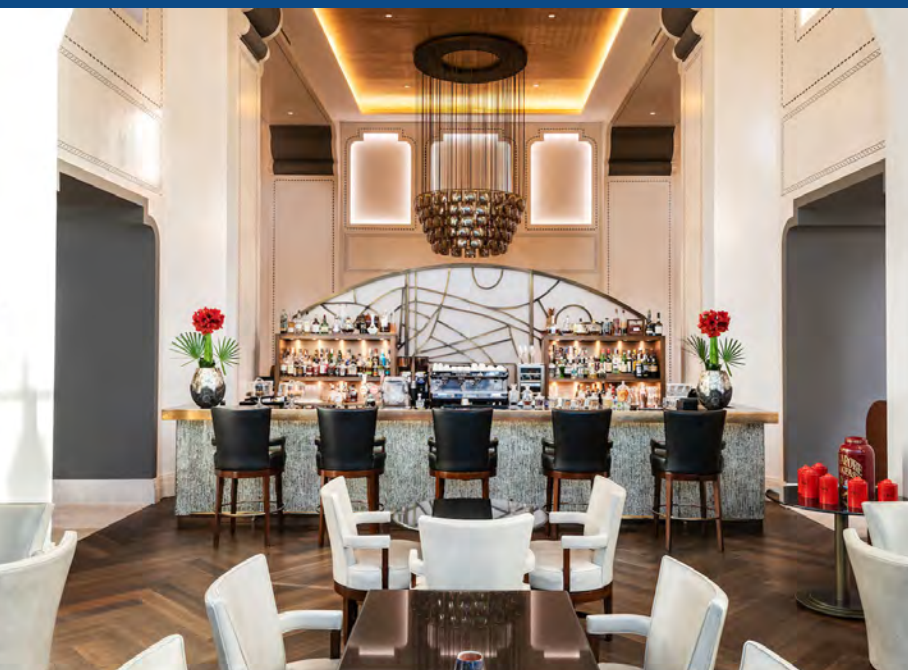

# Place de la Palud

Place de la Palud is the lively heart of Lausanne's historic center. At its center stands the city's oldest fountain, topped with a statue symbolizing justice. Every hour between 9:00 and 19:00, an animated clock narrates the history of the Vaud region with moving scenes.

On Wednesday and Saturday mornings, the square hosts a bustling local market that spills into the nearby pedestrian streets. Every first Friday of the month, a craft market adds to the vibrant atmosphere. Traditional cafés, elegant boutiques, and upscale shops complete the experience in this fully pedestrianized, high-end district.



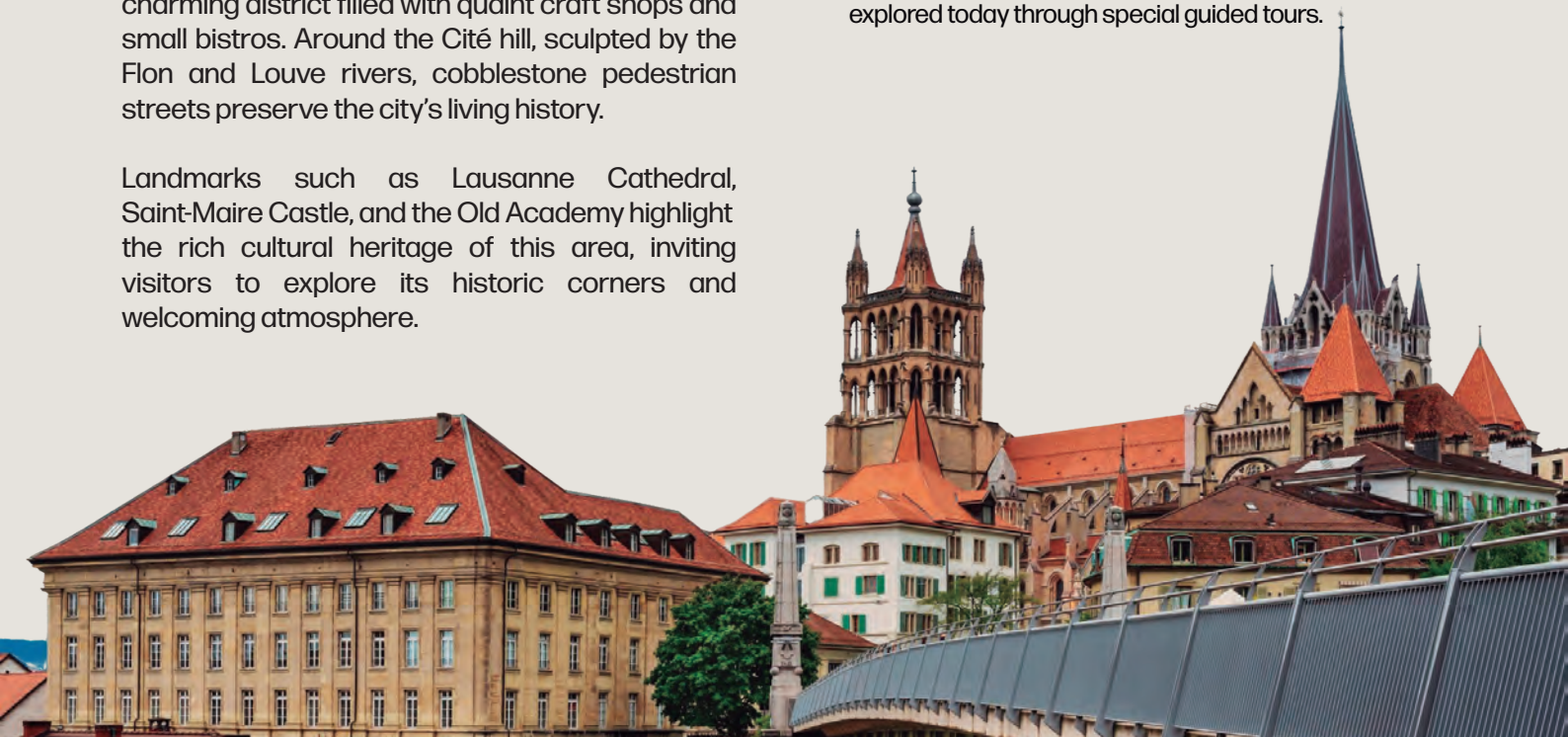
# La Cité

La Cité is the medieval soul of Lausanne, a charming district filled with quaint craft shops and small bistros. Around the Cité hill, sculpted by the Flon and Louve rivers, cobblestone pedestrian streets preserve the city's living history.

Landmarks such as Lausanne Cathedral, Saint-Maire Castle, and the Old Academy highlight the rich cultural heritage of this area, inviting visitors to explore its historic corners and welcoming atmosphere.

Beneath the streets of La Cité are medieval galleries that were once used for defense and storage, and can still be explored today through special guided tours.



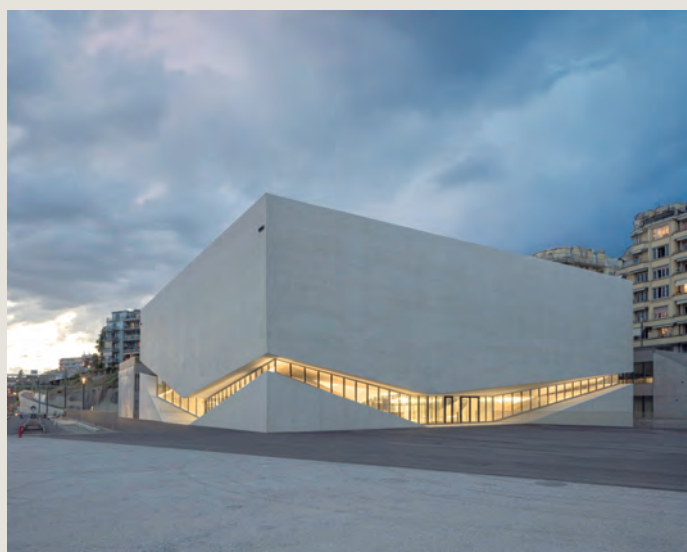
# Lausanne Cathedral

Lausanne Cathedral, located at Place de la Cathédrale, is a Gothic masterpiece that has stood over the city for more than eight centuries. Its harmonious architecture and intricate sculpted details captivate visitors, conveying a deep sense of serenity. Visitors can climb the tower—free with the City Pass—for exceptional panoramic views over the rooftops of the Cité, Lake Geneva, and the Alps, blending history and nature in perfect harmony.



# Rolex Learning Center

This innovative space serves as a learning laboratory, housing a library with 500,000 volumes and functioning as an international cultural hub open to students and the public alike. # Lake Geneva

Adding to its charm, Lake Geneva is famous for its historic fleet of steamships, which have been ferrying passengers across the lake for over a century. These elegant boats connect various towns and cities along the shoreline, offering a scenic and leisurely way to explore the region—from the cosmopolitan city of Lausanne to the picturesque villages nestled among the vineyards and mountains. This network not only highlights the lake's natural beauty but also fosters cultural exchange and



# Olympic Museum

The museum also highlights the cultural and social impact of the Olympics worldwide, emphasizing themes such as peace, diversity, and human achievement.



Did you know?

The Olympic Museum in Lausanne houses over 10,000 Olympic artifacts, including the first Olympic flag from 1913 and torches from every Games since 1936. It's the largest archive of Olympic memorabilia in the world, making it a must-visit for sports and history lovers alike.

The Olympic Museum is the most visited museum in Lausanne – and one of the most visited in all of Switzerland – welcoming over 250,000 guests annually from around the world.



# Lavaux



Lavaux is one of Switzerland's most breathtaking landscapes—a sweeping stretch of terraced vineyards cascading gently toward the shores of Lake Geneva, framed by the majestic backdrop of the Alps. This UNESCO World Heritage Site, located between Lausanne and Montreux, offers much more than stunning views: it represents centuries of human ingenuity, agricultural tradition, and a deep-rooted connection to the land.

The vineyards of Lavaux date back to the 11th century, when Benedictine and Cistercian monks began cultivating the steep hillsides to make use of the region's unique microclimate. Today, the terraced layout remains a masterpiece of manual labor and sustainable farming, with stone walls that retain the sun's warmth and help ripen the grapes. The result is a vibrant wine culture, especially known for Chasselas, a delicate white wine that beautifully expresses the character of the local terroir.



Exploring Lavaux is a sensory experience. The scent of the vines, the shimmer of the lake below, and the peaceful rhythm of the countryside invite visitors to slow down and reconnect with nature. A network of footpaths winds through the vineyards, linking charming wine-growing villages such as Cully, Epesses, Dézaley, and Saint-Saphorin, each offering its own personality, wine cellars, and unforgettable views.

Beyond hiking, Lavaux offers the opportunity to taste wines directly with local producers, who are often eager to share stories of their land, their heritage, and the passion behind every bottle. Scenic train rides and lake cruises also offer alternative ways to appreciate the unique beauty of this cultural landscape.



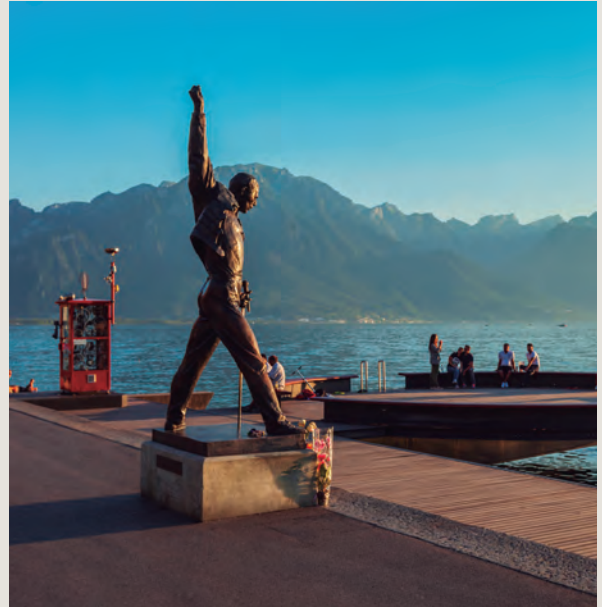
# Montreux

## Chillon Castle

Just a few minutes from Montreux, Chillon Castle rises from a rocky islet on Lake Geneva, resembling a scene from a medieval tale. One of the most visited castles in Europe, it boasts over a thousand years of history. Once a fortress and residence of the Counts of Savoy, today it invites visitors to explore its towers, courtyards, dungeons, and grand halls while enjoying sweeping views of the lake and mountains. Its well-preserved rooms and architecture offer a fascinating glimpse into life in the Middle Ages.



## Freddie Mercury and Queen's Legacy

Freddie Mercury spent extended periods during the final years of his life. Queen recorded several albums at the iconic Mountain Studios, inside the Montreux Casino, including their last album, *Made in Heaven*. Today, the space hosts the free Queen Studio Experience exhibition, showcasing original recordings, instruments, and memorabilia. Just outside, the bronze statue of Freddie Mercury, facing the lake, stands as a lasting tribute to his bond with the city.

## Montreux Jazz Festival

The Montreux Jazz Festival, held every July since 1967, is one of the world's most iconic music festivals. Originally focused on jazz, it now features a wide range of genres and attracts top international artists, transforming the city into a vibrant musical hub.

# Vevey

Located on the northern shore of Lake Geneva, Vevey is a picturesque town rich in history that blends Swiss charm with a lively artistic and cultural scene. With its pedestrian-friendly old town, weekly markets, and lakeside promenade, Vevey is an ideal destination to explore local traditions, gastronomy, and contemporary art.

## **Charles Chaplin and His Legacy in Vevey**

Originally part of an advertising campaign for the famous local dairy brand Alimenta, the fork has become a symbol of the town and a must-see photo spot, framed by stunning views of the lake and mountains.

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# Gstaad

Set in the heart of the Swiss Alps, Gstaad is a timeless destination where luxury meets authenticity. With its charming wooden chalets, upscale boutiques, and breathtaking mountain scenery, the village offers a refined yet relaxed atmosphere throughout the year. Known for attracting artists, royals, and adventurers alike, Gstaad perfectly balances outdoor adventure with cultural sophistication, all wrapped in pristine alpine beauty.

One of the summer highlights in Gstaad is the prestigious Swiss Open Gstaad, a professional ATP tennis tournament held every July at the Roy Emerson Arena. First played in 1915, it is one of the oldest tennis tournaments in Switzerland and part of the ATP 250 circuit. Set at 1,050 meters above sea level, the clay court competition is renowned for being one of the highest-altitude tournaments on the tour, offering a unique challenge for players.

Surrounded by the mountains, the stadium provides a stunning and intimate setting, where spectators enjoy not only top-tier tennis but also regional cuisine, live entertainment, and a lively social scene. The event seamlessly blends world-class sport with the charm and elegance that define Gstaad – making it a must for tennis lovers and summer visitors alike.



## *Did you know?*

Each autumn, Gstaad celebrates the traditional Alpabfahrt, when decorated cows descend from the high alpine pastures back into the valley. Adorned with flower crowns and large bells, the cows parade through the village – a joyful event that marks the end of summer grazing season and highlights the region's deep agricultural heritage.



# Glacier 3000

Just 15km from Gstaad lies one of the most breathtaking attractions in the Swiss Alps: Glacier 3000. Situated over 3,000 meters above sea level, this high-altitude glacier offers a unique alpine experience that blends dramatic scenery, unforgettable activities, and surprisingly easy access.

The journey begins with a scenic cable car ride from Col du Pillon, ascending rapidly above forests and slopes until reaching the upper station. There, a snow-covered wonderland opens up—even in the middle of summer. The main attraction is the “Peak Walk by Tissot”, the world’s first and only suspension bridge that connects two mountain peaks. From here, you can see more than 20 peaks over 4,000 meters, including iconic summits like Mont Blanc, the Matterhorn, and the Jungfrau.

Beyond the bridge, Glacier 3000 offers a variety of activities for all adventure levels: from summer snowshoe hikes and thrilling sled runs on icy tracks to the Alpine Coaster—the highest roller coaster in the world—and hiking trails adapted to the glacial terrain. Photography enthusiasts will find this one of the most spectacular spots to capture the majesty of the Alps.

For those seeking a more relaxed experience, the panoramic restaurant designed by Mario Botta offers fine cuisine paired with unforgettable views. Sitting down with a glass of wine and a plate of Swiss specialties while overlooking the endless white landscape is a quiet luxury only this place can offer.



## The Cheese Grotto

Deep within the mountains surrounding Gstaad lies one of the region’s best-kept secrets: the Cheese Grotto, a unique underground sanctuary where over 3,000 wheels of alpine cheese age naturally in perfect conditions. Once a military bunker, this cave has been transformed into a one-of-a-kind refinement and tasting space for true cheese lovers.

Visitors learn about the traditional aging process and then enjoy a tasting of handcrafted alpine cheeses, served with rustic bread, local wine, and—if you choose—the experience culminates in a fondue meal surrounded by stunning mountain scenery. It’s a rustic, flavorful, and deeply Swiss experience.
